PAPER -I HISTORY OF INDIAN ART (Prehistoric to Gupta Period)

- I. Prehistoric art :- Cave Paintings
- II. Indus valley civilization (2500 BC to 1500 BC)
- III. Mauryan Empire :- Pillar inscriptions, Sarnath Capital, Yaksha Figures, Sudama and Lomasha Rishi Cave, Animal Carvings.
- IV. Sunga Period :- Stupas and Toranas: Sculpture- Bharhut-Shalbhanjika, Relief Medallion-Mriga Jataka, Viharas and Chaitya (Karle and Bhaja).
- V. Kushan Period :- Gandhara School- Standing Buddha from Moti Mardan, Nirvan of Buddha (Relief), Mhayan-Buddha,

Mathura School – Statue of Kanishka, Seated Buddha of Katra.

- VI. Gupta Period :- Sculpture: Standing Buddha from Mathura. Painting: Ajanta, Bodhisattiva Cave No. 1, Apsara Cave No. 17, Architecture: sanchi str.No 17, Vishnu-temple-Deogarh.

PAPER –I History of Art

(A) India: Prehistoric Art – Cave Paintings, Indus Valley Civilization and its Art, Mauryan period (Court Art – Sarnath Capital, Stupa, Folk Art, Yaksha-Yakshini etc.) Sunga Period (Monuments – Bharhut, Bodhgaya, Stupas) Kushan Period (Gandhar, Mathura) Gupta Period (Ajanta, Bagh, Painting) terracotta.

South India:- Pallav Dynasty; Mahabalipuram. Rastrakuta Dynasty; Ellora, Elephanta. Amaravati, Nagarjunakonda.

relating to Empathy and Pleasure (Ananda), Interrelationship of above concep relevance to Art,

Introduction to the philosophy of Indian Arts & Aesthetics and Thinkers – Bharatmuni, Abhinavgupta: (Ras-Siddhant : Bhava, Vibhav, Anubhav), Ananda Kentish Coomaraswamy; Brief study of the basic principles of philosophy of Art and religion, Vedic Upanisad, Buddhist, Jain, Saivite and Shakti, Chitra Sutra- Pratimalakshan, Talman, etc.
